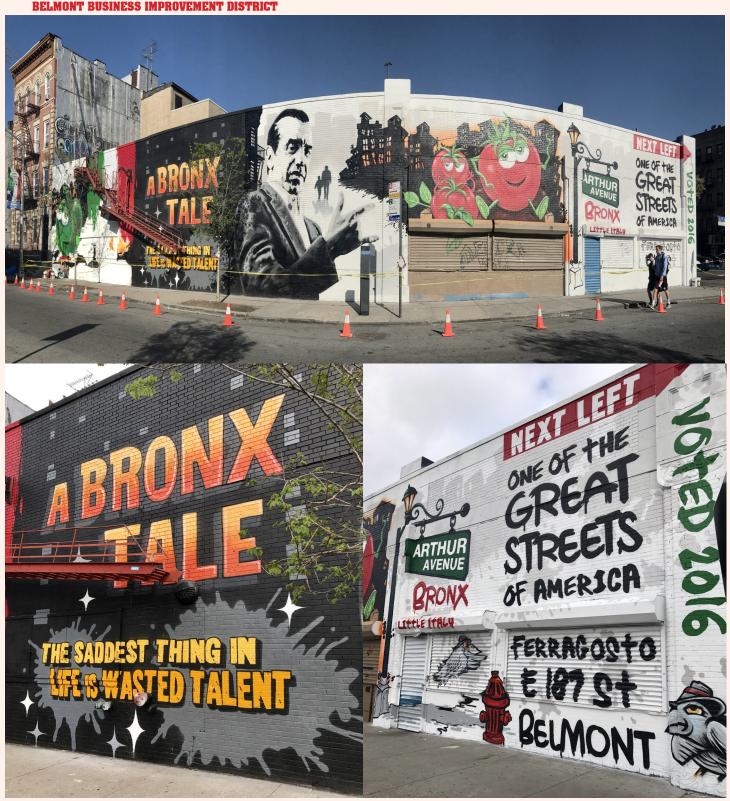

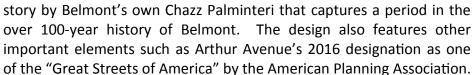


New Mural

Bronx Little Italy has a new mural! Painted on the strategic corner of Hughes Avenue and Fordham Road, the mural is highly visible to those arriving from Pelham Parkway and exiting from Hughes Avenue. The statement piece is sure to welcome visitors to the neighborhood. The project, funded by the Belmont BID, was designed by Mike A., a detail driven artist-designer with over 20 years of experience, who has work featured on the world-



renowned Wynnewood Walls and the W Hotel in Miami. Located on a 136-foot long wall, it celebrates the movie and now Broadway show "A Bronx Tale," a biographical



Mike. A., the contemporary artist originally from the Bronx, was also able to seamlessly incorporate his

own signature design elements of fruit and vegetables. The mural was a tremendous project made possible by many including Chazz Palminteri; Esther Zarembski, the owner of the building; Abe Abdallah, the owner of Fordham Hand Car Wash; Joe Clarke, who secured the location; Frank Franz, who worked with the artist;



Phil Foglia who worked with the BID on behalf of Chazz Palminteri; Councilman Torres; Deputy Inspector McCormack and the 48th Precinct; the BID board of directors, who provided support and encouragement; and Phil and Alyssa, who coordinated the project. The BID hopes that the mural will inspire a wave of new and attractive artwork throughout the community.

My Arthur Avenue Commercial

The BID is excited to share that the FORT Group has been hired to film a commercial that captures the authentic experience of being part of the real Little Italy. The commercial is centered around the slogan "My Arthur Avenue," which promotes the idea of developing a personal relationship with the neighborhood and its vibrant sense of community. The BID decided to produce a commercial to expand awareness of the neighborhood, attract more visitors and consumers, and promote the designation of Arthur Avenue as one of the "Great Streets of America". The scenes of the commercial will depict daily life in the neighborhood, such as the hustle and bustle of shoppers seeking Italian groceries, behind-the-scenes footage of merchants and their goods, and people enjoying Italian delicacies. No specific business names will be shown in the commercial, but rather viewers will get a taste of all the neighborhood has to offer. Filming was recently completed and the BID will have a commercial ready to air on cablevision soon. The BID hopes this will create an opportunity for individual businesses to build on our work, and even contract to make commercials of their own, utilizing the branding theme that we believe will be created with this first generic commercial.

The Belmont BID is excited to announce the line-up of events for this year. We were going to kick things off with our 3rd Annual Art Show, however due to the forecast it was rescheduled for July 15th. The Art Show will bring vibrant artists from around the area to showcase their work and talent. All modes of art are welcome, including photography, oil paintings, and drawings, so art enthusiasts are sure to enjoy this event. In partnership with SBH Health System, the "Picture a Healthier You" Health Fair is coming on June 4th from 10-



2pm, and will be held on Crescent Avenue. Attendees will have the chance to participate in free health screenings, fitness activities, raffles, and more. This year we're enthusiastic about introducing Jazz Saturdays to the summer months. Each Saturday we will bring a jazz band to East 186th Street to brighten up the neighborhood and provide lively entertainment. Tables and chairs will also be set so visitors have the opportunity to relax from the hustle and bustle. Jazz Saturdays are scheduled for July 8th, 15th, 22nd, 29th, August 5th, 12th, 19th, and 26th from 12-6pm. The 3rd Annual Car Show will return to Crescent Avenue on July 9th from 11-4pm. In case of rain, the event will be held on July 16th. Classic cars, muscle cars, imported cars and more will make an appearance at the event that also features trophies, raffles, entertainment. Our well-loved Ferragosto festival will return on September 10th from 12-6pm on Arthur Avenue. The best of the neighborhood will be on display, so don't miss the music, entertainment, food, and excitement! The BID is thrilled to share another new event, NYC Pizza Festival, premiering on October 7th and 8th from 12-6pm on Crescent Avenue and East 186th St. The festival will be a national, star-studded event

showcasing the talents of the United States most renowned pizza makers as well as top pizza makers from Italy. Attendees will be able to enjoy pizza tastings with wine and beer as live music plays. To celebrate Columbus Day, there will be live entertainment, tables and chairs, and Italian characters on October 9th from 11am-4pm on East 186th Street. As tradition goes, the holiday season will officially kick off with the Annual Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony on Saturday, December 2nd from 4-6pm in Ciccarone Park. Leading up to Christmas, carolers, and Santa and his elves will also be making special appearances in the neighborhood. It's definitely going to be an exciting year and we're looking forward to your feedback particularly as we embark on new events.
