Events

2017 was quite an exciting and productive year for the BID! Our Ferragosto festival saw approximately 28,000 attendees from the tristate area and beyond. Everyone wanted to be a part of our annual celebration that includes Italian culture, live entertainment and of course, the greatest food anywhere. We are already looking forward to inviting everyone back for Ferragosto 2018! We continued our participation in the DOT Weekend Walks program, which included our Health Fair, Art Show, Jazz Saturdays, Blue Knights Motorcycle Run, and Columbus Day Celebration. We were also able to sponsor special



events throughout the year like Italian Heritage Month with Bronx Borough President Diaz, and Turkeys for Thanksgiving with Councilman Torres. We were also fortunate enough to partner with Councilman Torres, Bronx Parent Housing Network, and the Red Cross, in collecting donations for the families displaced by the horrific fire that took place on Prospect Avenue in late December.

My Arthur Avenue Commercial

One of the biggest highlights of the year definitely had to be when our "My Arthur Avenue" commercial premiered in the fall. We took on the assignment of capturing the spirit and essence of the neighborhood and exhibiting it into a 30 second commercial. The commercial successfully exemplifies the idea of developing a personal relationship with the neighborhood and its vibrant sense of community. The commercial later even won GOLD in the Video/Audio category for the MarCom Awards. It is our hope that individual businesses will build off the theme, and tag line, to highlight their individual artisanal goods and products. We also plan on airing the commercial again this winter to audiences in

different areas than we had first targeted.



A Bronx Tale Mural

As you are certainly aware, this year also saw the completion of our very first BID sponsored mural. The mural was painted on the strategic corner of Hughes Avenue and Fordham Road. The location was chosen for its high visibility and grand scale. A portion of the mural is a celebration of "A Bronx Tale" by Belmont's own Chazz Palminteri. The artist, Mike A., was also able to seamlessly incorporate his own signature design elements of fruits and vegetables. It is our hope that this will go on to inspire additional attractive murals within the Belmont neighborhood.

Attracting Quality Businesses to the Neighborhood

A goal of the BID this past year was to begin work on filling the vacancies within the district with quality businesses. To attract these businesses, our landlord committee has worked with marketing firm, JGSC Group. JGSC Group conducted a shopper demographic survey and a pedestrian count survey. With this data, marketing materials were created and will be distributed to brokers and potential retail prospects. The BID also hopes to act as facilitators at future retail recruitment events.

A Safer Community

We were also able to work closely with the 48 Precinct and the District Attorney's office to get harsher punishments and increased bails for the individuals who have been aggressively panhandling, tagging graffiti, and threatening the quality of life and the economic well-being of our business community.

Looking Ahead

Looking to the future, we will continue to develop the "Little Italy in the Bronx" brand and introduce new customers to our community, as well as entertain our current visitors. There are exciting events and opportunities this year that we are looking forward to that will help distinguish the neighborhood as the unique and authentic destination we all know it is.
